







### Prof. Lau Kwok Ying, Associate Director of RIH



# RIH Highlights

### "Principles of Cultural Dynamics" (PCD) Network

#### Introduction to the PCD Network

The PCD network, based at the Dahlem Humanities Center at Free University Berlin, desires to research the factors that may account for what triggers processes of cultural innovation, what catalyzes and hinders them, respectively, and what causes them to subside entirely. The PCD network is a four-year project funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and has six partner institutes:

- 1.Dahlem Humanities Center, Free University Berlin (FUB)
- 2. Mahindra Humanities Center, Harvard University
- 3. Faculty of Humanities, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem
- 4.Research Institute for the Humanities, the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK)
- 5. École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales (EHESS), Paris
- 6. Humanities Center, the Johns Hopkins University

The most important programs of the PCD network are exchange programs and Global Humanities Campus. This year, CUHK hosts two visitors from Berlin.


#### Visitors to CUHK



"The Xiantian hushi jilian youke Circulated in Hong Kong"











### "Ancient Divination and Research Methods" Lecture and Workshop



### Distinguished Lectureship in Islamic Civilization



The three delivered lectures are as follows:


- 1. Islam as an Open Civilization (6 April 2017)

- 3. Pleasure of Faith (8 April 2017)








# International Conference on "Food and Drink in Islamic Societies and Cultures"





The conference, held on 27–28 April 2017, focused on halal (清真). It brought together around 30 scholars from 17 countries and regions, including East Asia, Southeast Asia, Western Asia, the Middle East, Europe, Africa and the US. It aimed to examine the complexity and diversity of attitudes and practices related to food and drink among Muslims in various parts of the Islamic world and beyond. Conference participants presented research from a variety of disciplines, including history, sociology, anthropology, literature, religious studies and law. Selected papers will be published by the CSIC.


### **Upcoming Events**

### **Recent Activities**

Conference: Phenomenology and Anti-Phenomenology in Post-war France (「戰後法國的現象學與反現象學思潮」學術研討會)

The vitality of the phenomenological movement in Post-war France is a phenomenon in itself. It has produced several generations of philosophers of great originality. Yet phenomenology in France has also faced constant challenges from other currents of humanistic thinking such as structuralism, post-structuralism, deconstruction, and post-modernism. These currents were born from the confluence of new discoveries in linguistics, psychoanalysis, anthropology, literary criticism, historiography, and other disciplines in the humanities and the social sciences. The joint effects of the encounter between phenomenology and anti-phenomenology have made France a unique cradleland of avant-garde thoughts in the last 70 years. In order to have a more in-depth understanding of the vibrant scene of contemporary French thought, the Edwin Cheng Foundation Asian Centre for Phenomenology organised a three-day conference on "Phenomenology and Anti-phenomenology in Post-war France" on 2-4 March 2017 in the Chinese University of Hong Kong.







### Visiting Postgraduates Gathering

The Centre organized a Visiting Postgraduates Gathering on 27 February 2017 at which Mr Szeto Man-chun Henry (Université de Bourgogne, Dijon, France) and Mr Lo Kwun-lam Clement (University of Cologne) shared their recent research progress with our postgraduate students and teachers. These two visiting postgraduate students worked on their research projects during their visiting period from 28 February to 5 March 2017 at the CUHK.

### Leung Po Chuen Research Centre for Hong Kong History and Humanities

### Academic exchange

In April and May 2017, Professor Ho Pui-yin, the Centre Director, delivered lectures as a Visiting Professor at the Institute of Health Policy and Management, National Taiwan University. Professor Ho presented three lectures on "Public Health in Historical Perspective", explaining the evolution and experience of public health in Hong Kong from four aspects, namely the development of water supply, land use, public housing policy and town planning.

### **Achievements**

In July 2017, a research project on the Contemporary Chinese History, commissioned by the Curriculum Development Office of the Education Bureau, was completed. The results of this research will be used to develop an e-learning resource package to support teachers in their teaching.



#### **Recent Activities**

### Field Trip to Sam Mun Tsai Village

On 12 March 2017, the Centre organized a field trip to Sam Mun Tsai, with around 40 students taking part. The field trip focused on the history of Sam Mun Tsai Village as well as giving students first-hand experience on fishermen's living conditions and their food culture.



Sam Mun Tsai Village is located at Yim Tin Tsai, Tai Po district, which is a historic fishing village. It was originally located on the eastern side of Pak Sha Tau, but was subsequently relocated due to the construction of the Plover Cove Reservoir in the 1960s. It was then renamed "Sam Mun Tsai New Fishermen Village". The field sites included the village and the Tai Po Geoheritage Centre.

### Field Trip to Sai Kung



On 24 September 2016, the Centre organized a field trip to Sai Kung for over 30 students.

Sai Kung is one of the settlements of indigenous inhabitants in the New Territories, in which the historical landmarks still reflect a traditional rural

society. Sai Kung was originally a traditional village with agriculture and fisheries, but has now been transformed into a tourist town. Through the trip, the students could learn more about the transformation of Sai Kung, from the past to the present. The Sai Kung Town Centre was the main field site for the trip, with two routes by the sea and the land respectively.






### **Scholarships**

The Centre is committed to training young generations of scholars. Leung Hung Kee Scholarships aim to provide financial support to outstanding CUHK History undergraduates to conduct research abroad. Each awardee receives a grant of up to HK\$20,000 to develop historical research skills and global awareness through fieldwork and/or archival research outside Hong Kong. In the 2016–17 academic year, a total of 10 History undergraduates received financial support from the Centre:

### **Academic exchange**

"Historical and Cultural of Health Behaviors" (健康行為的歷史與文化脈絡)

Prof. Hsiung Ping-chen, Director of Taiwan Research Centre, gave lectures and participated in the colloquiums for the course "Historical and Cultural of Health Behaviors" (Chinese: 健康行為的歷史與文化脈絡) at National Taiwan University on 25, 26 Aug, 1 and 2 Sep, this summer. Adapting B.F. Skinner's classic book in establishing the foundations of behavioral science Beyond Freedom and Dignity (1971), this course aimed at examining the historical background and cultural elements behind health behaviors in order to investigate, consider and debate on the humanly constructed "environment" as opposed to bio-physically, genetically, based conditions of critical social conducts. In this year, the course aimed at studying "Pain and Bliss in life(苦樂人生)". Four films, which are related to topics on health behaviors, were

- 1. Memories of Tomorrow (2006) (Jap: 明日の記憶)
- 2. Sicko (2007)

shown in the classes:

- 3. Together (2010), (Chi: 在一起)
- 4. To Live (1952), (Jap: 生きる)

Students taking the course were required to form groups and prepare audio-visual presentations in class and submit a paper with around 2000 words at the end of course.
